Uxbridge News

The main news from Uxbridge this past year has been the pay parking issue in the main parking lots along the 6th and 7th concessions. To date, \$100k has been collected through day and season permits. Portions of this amount have been used for bridge construction, winter snow plowing of parking lots, one porta-potty at the Towers lot and most recently, a \$1200 grant to ORTA for lumber used on the recent boardwalk build. Funds have also been allotted to TRCA for mowing trails other than ORTA trails, which are still maintained by ORTA volunteers.

Thanks go to Green Durham for organizing the chainsaw safety course and the purchase of battery powered maintenance equipment—chainsaws, hedge trimmers, string trimmers and gas powered mowers (these last are still more dependable than battery units for heavy use on our trails).

Unfortunately, most ORTA hikes and many other group and family outings now avoid the main Uxbridge trail systems due to the complexity of daily passes, lack of phone data or just the cost of repeated short term visits. The discussions continue about the future of this program.

Colouring Courtship:

Studies on Hummingbird Colouration and Courtship Dances.

Our Guest Speaker:

Dr. Rick Simpson,

Program Director, Central Ontario—West Nature Conservancy of Canada

Dr. Simpson studied 6 species of hummingbirds in the Southwest United States: Allen's, Anna's, Costa's, Calliope's, black-chinned, and broad-tailed hummingbirds. The presentation will start by going over some general information on how animals use colour to communicate, then talk about hummingbirds and why they are so interesting, and finally about his specific PhD dissertation research on hummingbird courtship dances and colouration.

Over the next few years I enjoyed many hikes with Bill, as well as working with him on club business, once I joined the Board. We spent many enjoyable times together. Bill and Chris hosted several ORTA Christmas parties in their Newmarket home. It was quite crowded!

Years have passed, we moved to BC, Bill’s health deteriorated, and we no longer saw each other. But my memories of good times with a good friend will always be a joy to me.”

“I also remember Bill well, starting with his prompt processing of our Membership application.

In the history of ORTA it's recorded that when he retired as Membership Coordinator it was necessary to recruit a team of three to handle the duties.

He often hiked with my group when I became a hike leader.

I believe he won by a step or two . . .”

National Hiker Award

Challenge for Canadian Hikers is almost here! Launching Nov 15th 2023!!

The National Hiker Award has been created by Hike Canada en Marche with a number of goals and exams for each level. There are two award sections, one for youth under 21 and one for adults with badges for each level to achieve.

Each age group has three levels of award. You must complete the first level before proceeding to a higher level. Upon registration, you will be sent the program details.

- Adult - National Award
- Adult - Advanced Award
- Adult - Distinguished Award

- Youth - National Brown Earth Award
- Youth - National Green Growth Award
- Youth - National Blue Sky Award

Each Award level will have its unique numbering up to the elite Distinguished Hiker Level top #100. There will be several steps for each level, with greater challenges as you work up to the Advanced, then Distinguished Hiker Levels

Registration starts November 15, 2023.

- \$20 Adult Registration Fee
- \$10 Youth

Once registered, you can access the program content and your personal log. These will be set out as a physical component and an online hiking skills component with multi-choice questions.

Physical component will consist of a hike, trail maintenance work and working at a community hiking event.

Online skills section will test your knowledge of long-distance hiking trails in Canada, historic trails, values, safety, first aid, weather, natural history and Indigenous trail connections.

Each award level will add to the depth and range of questions as well as requiring more physical challenges as you progress to the Advanced and Distinguished levels.

Be ready to challenge yourself to be a knowledgeable and proficient hiker as you proceed from level to level, and be recognized by your hiking peers across Canada.
