AGM 2023–Lissa Dwyer

Thanks very much to all the members who were able to join us on the 27th to celebrate the year that was 2022. There was an excellent turn out at the Ballantrae Community Centre on a lovely spring evening for our first in person event since 2019. What a delight to listen to the joyful sounds of almost 75 people coming together again!

One of the issues that we discussed again is the effective and cost saving solution to vet our financials with a review committee instead of an auditor. We will ask again every year as we did with the request in the past to renew with our prior auditors. Anna Sunn, from our review committee, puts it this way:

Under Ontario's Not-for-Profit-Corporations Act (ONCA), ORTA falls under a new category of nonprofits called public benefit corporations. Nonprofits, that are charities, will **always** be a public benefit corporation (PBC). As a PBC, ORTA can waive having either an annual audit or a review engagement as long as gross revenue is less than \$100,000. In order to waive this requirement, an extraordinary resolution must be passed by a special vote, with at least 80% of members present voting in favour (or all members need to agree to it in writing). When a vote requires more than the usual amount of support from your members, it is called an extraordinary resolution and every extraordinary resolution must be voted on once a year.

Thanks for taking this route with us as we continue to manage costs in our new reality.

Of course, the other primary message of the event is that new people are always welcome and much needed to help shoulder the load in many areas. Continued gratitude to all of you who are volunteering their time and energy to contribute to the success of ORTA.




